What can your Web site do with CareerOneStop data?

Find wages by occupation: Build a salary tool letting users select an occupation and find average hourly or annual wages for the United States or a selected state. Also compare wages across occupations or geographical areas.

Build an occupation profile: Deliver detailed occupation data for more than 800 occupations. Data include:

- Knowledge, skills, and abilities by occupation
- Tasks and activities by occupation
- Common tools and technology used in select occupations

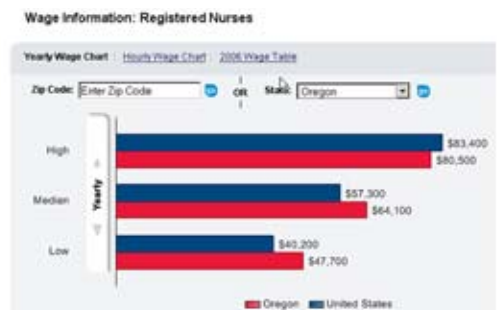
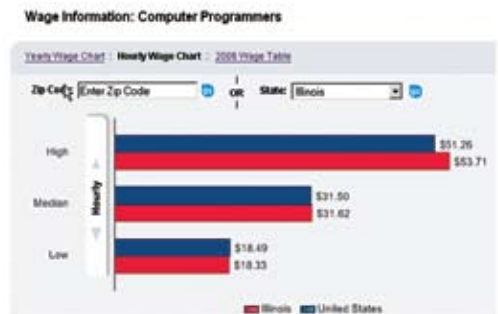
Find and translate military occupation information: Search for military occupations by branch of service, keywords, or military occupational codes (MOCs). Then, identify similar civilian occupations.

Get occupational licensing information: Search a database of occupational licensing information by state, occupation, or keyword.

Get certification information: Search a database of occupational certification information by occupation, industry, or keyword.

Find a One-Stop Career Center: Locate and get directions to your nearest One-Stop Career Center via Zip code or city.

Find job bank Web sites: Find a continuously updated list of state-sponsored job bank Web site links.
